1. Summary

Some students at Mariville School are enrolled into the institution with below average reading skills or not being to read at all. These students make it to 5th year and leave the institution without mastering key concepts of reading. Read-A-Gram focuses on developing students' literacy and reading skills. The project will give Mariville School a competitive advantage over other secondary schools for addressing such a dire and important need and ensuring that all students develop reading skills when they leave their institution.

2. Current Issue

- The need for action is prompted by the number of students who reach fifth year and are not entered for any external examinations because they have deficiencies in their reading. These students simply enter the institution and leave without being able to successfully sit any examinations. Subsequently, they enter the world of work and are unable to function effectively and can be taken advantage of and may have to pass up profitable opportunities
- Presently, approximately 32 students in the current first year group of a total of 146 students, exhibit literacy deficiencies. As a learning institution, we strive for each student to leave the school with the ability to read. This is reinforced in the inclusion of reading and English literature in the English Programme as part of students' timetables especially in the junior school. This therefore leaves a gap and indicates that we may not be meeting our goals
- The root cause of students' reading deficiencies is students' literacy skills not being developed in their formative years. This may be caused by poor reinforcements in their home and primary school environment. This may have been caused by teachers and parents not spending enough time on developing students' reading skills.
- A problem such as this impacts students and their family's lives. It also has a direct impact
 on the school's personnel such as teachers, the remaining student body and teachers
